II. Objectives

Participants can learn the current situation, developing trend and prospect of China's maternal and child health. 2. Participants can learn the policy and management of China's maternal and child health care services. 3. Participants can share the experience in promoting maternal and child health of China. 4. Participants can provide suggestions on the related field based on his/her own nation's condition.

III. Core Contents

The contents composed of 3 parts: lectures, experience sharing and field visits.

Lectures: The lectures will consist of macroscopic strategy and outcome sharing. In macroscopic strategic perspective and based on frames of ICPD POA and MDGs, seminar will review the latest progress and dynamics of promoting maternal and child health care in international community by setting lectures such as *Report on China's Maternal and Child Health Progress*, *Financing Research on Maternal and Child Health*, so as to help improve the capacity in policy-making and law-making field by generally introducing China's current achievement and future challenges. In outcome perspective, seminar will share China's experience and strategy in promoting maternal and child health by setting lectures such as *China's Experience and Strategy on Promoting Maternal Health*, *Planning and Management in Maternal and Child Health Care*.

Experience Sharing: Based on learning and national situation, participants will seek for better cultivating the field through challenges discussing and experience sharing.

Field Visits: Seminar will arrange participants visit the maternal and child health care institutions so that participants can better understand the current situation of the public service system in provincial-, municipal- and county- levels. In addition, participants will have a round understanding of China's social economic development through traditional cultural activities.
