About the Project

Background: As the world's largest developing country, China has paid attention to and been supportive of other developing countries' endeavors in improving people's livelihoods and seeking development. President Xi Jinping, thinking about China's responsibility from a global perspective, has put forward a series of new ideas and initiatives such as building a community of shared future for mankind, and the Belt and Road Initiatives. To positively promote the implementation of the Global Development Initiatives (GDI), China will continue to strengthen practical cooperation in areas such as infrastructure construction and energy. To this end, China will give full play to the role of the China Cooperation and Development Fund, and cultivate new growth points in economy and trade by focusing on green and low-carbon technologies, trade in services and the digital economy, so as to further promote the economic and technical cooperation between China and other developing countries.

Purpose: The purpose of this seminar organized by Chinese Government is to share experiences and deepen friendship through mutual learning and exchanges, and build a platform for exchanges and cooperation between China and other developing countries in the field of the promotion of the economic and technical cooperation, so as to reduce global poverty and allow peoples of different countries to share the benefits of the world's economic growth.

Content: The seminar will give lectures on various topics such as China's national conditions, Chinese leaders' philosophy of governance, China's experience in reform, opening-up and economic development, the status quo and potential of China's economic and trade cooperation, China's international trade in technology, China's policies and measures for attracting foreign investment, Chinese enterprises' outbound investment, the development of China's international trade in services, the basic situation and management system of China's overseas labor cooperation, China's foreign aid and international development assistance, China's green economy and low-carbon transition, etc.

Methods: The seminar will invite Chinese experts in the relevant fields of the promotion of economic and technical cooperation to give lectures on various topics; organize exchanges between participants and experts, and among participants; organize study tours to relevant enterprises engaged in the promotion of economic and technical cooperation in Beijing and other cities.

- 1. Please prepare your passport, Chinese visa and third-party transit country visa (if necessary) before coming to China.
- 2. - 3. In principle, it is not allowed for individuals to change their tickets to China. If you really need to do so, please contact the Economic and Trade Office and follow the procedures to change your ticket. Participants who change their tickets without consent will be notified to the Economic and Trade Office and the costs and liabilities therefore incurred shall be borne by yourself.
- 4. After picking up the luggage, please wait patiently at the international arrival exit (or domestic arrival exit) and the organizer will pick you up with a pick-up board with your name on it. If waiting for more than 15 minutes, you can communicate with the organizer by phone.
- 5. In case your baggage is lost and you need to register the loss with the airline, please first communicate with the organizer to confirm the baggage delivery location and then fill in the registration form.
