About the Organizer	<p>Established in 1996, the International Exchange Center of the Health Commission of Sichuan Province is an independent legal entity directly under the Commission. It mainly undertakes foreign aid medical tasks assigned by the state, including the selection, training, management and continuing education of foreign aid medical teams sent by the province, the paired support and other medical aid programs assigned by the state, and the health foreign aid training programs assigned by the Ministry of Commerce. It carries out domestic and foreign exchanges and cooperation in the field of health care.</p> <p>The purpose of the Center is to strengthen international cooperation and exchange and to serve foreign health aid of the state. As of the end of 2022, the Center has sent a total of 84 medical teams to nine countries in Africa, Asia and Oceania (Mozambique, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau, Sao Tome and Principe, Nauru, UAE, Vanuatu, Timor-Leste, Angola), with a total of 984 people (team member enrollments) and receiving nearly seven million patient visits. At the same time, with the recommendation of the National Health Commission and the support of the Health Commission of Sichuan Province, the Center started to undertake medical foreign aid training programs assigned by the Ministry of Commerce since 2003, mainly for developing countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America to carry out training in HIV/AIDS prevention and control, public health, traditional Chinese medicine and acupuncture, maternal and child health, clinical nursing, etc. The programs were conducted in English, French, Portuguese, and Spanish. By the end of 2022, a total of 67 multi/bilateral training courses/seminars have been organized, involving 73 countries and regions, and a total of 1,704 health officials and technical personnel.</p>

2. Workshops

Workshops will be organized around the topics of the adaptation of patient visit procedures and nosocomial infection control during epidemics. In-depth discussion will be held on topics of interest to the participants.

Participants will also share their own experience around the theme of the seminar with Chinese speakers.

3. Field visits

Participants will visit hospitals in China with advanced medical technology and rich clinical experience, learn about the adapting of patient visit procedures and the level and technology of nosocomial infection control during epidemics in Sichuan and China as a whole, and exchange useful experiences with each other.

At the same time, participants will visit the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding, Dujiangyan Water Conservancy Project and other places of interest to understand China's traditional culture and the current social development, so that they can experience a "true" China.

1 WU Jiayu: Director of Infection Control Center of Sichuan Provincial People's Hospital, member of Chengdu Special Committee on Infectious Diseases. Chief Physician with extensive experience in nosocomial infection control and management of the clinical application of antibacterial drugs.

2 BAI Lang: Party Branch Secretary, Deputy Director, and Professor at the Center for Infectious Diseases, West China Hospital, Sichuan University. Vice President of Infectious Disease Branch of Sichuan International Medical Exchange & Promotion Association. He is very good at the prevention and control of infectious diseases. During the epidemic, as the temporary Secretary of the Party Branch of Guang'an medical team of West China Hospital of Sichuan University, he led the team to successfully complete the task. At the same time, he is also very good at teaching and won the "Jiang Weiping Excellent Teaching Award" by Sichuan University.

3 HE Shenghua: Director of the Department of Infectious Diseases, Public Health Clinical Center of Chengdu. Chief Physician, Master Supervisor, Director of Infectious Diseases Department. He currently serves as member of the AIDS Group of the Infectious Diseases Branch of the Chinese Medical Association, member of the Special Committee of Infectious Diseases of Sichuan Medical Association, and head of Sichuan Provincial HIV ART Expert Group.

To facilitate the exchange with Chinese experts, please prepare presentations related to the training topics, such as: self introduction including your specialty and department; adaptation of patient visit procedures and nosocomial infection control during epidemics in your country; and cooperation with China.
