Inner Mongolia Agricultural University (IMAU) is a multi-disciplinary university with a focus on agriculture and forestry, characterized by grassland animal husbandry, and eight disciplines including agriculture, engineering, science, economics, management, humanities, law, and arts. It has a complete higher education system for cultivating vocational colleges, bachelor's, master's, and doctoral students. In 2001, it became a key university supported by the "One Province, One University" in the national western development. In 2012, it became a "provincial and ministerial co construction" university jointly established by the State Forestry Administration (now the State Forestry and Grassland Administration) and the People's Government of the autonomous region. In 2013, it entered the ranks of supporting universities in the national "Central and Western Higher Education Revitalization Plan".

Inner Mongolia Agricultural University is the earliest university in Inner Mongolia to carry out education for foreign students and exchange of visiting scholars. It has established intercollegiate cooperation and academic exchange relationships with more than 70 universities and research institutions from more than 20 countries, including the United Kingdom, the United States, Canada, Australia, Russia, Japan, and Mongolia, and has rich experience in training and managing international students and technical personnel. The teaching infrastructure, teaching equipment, textbooks, teachers, laboratories, internship bases, and other teaching conditions for international students and foreign technical personnel training are complete. There are specialized foreign experts and student buildings provided for international students, and the accommodation environment and medical system are very perfect. More than 700 experts and professors from abroad have come to the university for academic exchange, visiting lectures, scientific research cooperation, and other activities. The school has set up the "the Belt and Road" Research Institute, and participated in the "the Belt and Road" education foreign aid projects, academic exchanges and scientific research cooperation.

In 2012, the school became the designated institution for China-aided training programs held by the Ministry of Commerce and is also the only university in Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region to undertake such projects. It has organized 40sessions of multilateral and bilateral China-aided training and trained a total of 1046 participants from 63 countries. In addition, it has been selected to participate in the "Chinese Intangible Cultural Heritage Inheritance Practitioners Training Program" jointly organized by the Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Education. In 2015, the school became the "Ministry of Education's Training Center for Overseas Study", with over 8000 trainees cumulatively, laying a solid foundation for communication and technical training between the school and foreign students and technicians.

1. About the Content

The seminar consists of the following lectures:

- (1) the basic reality of China, the open-up and reform and achievements of China in politics, economy, society and culture;
- (2) an introduction to veterinary medicine: a comprehensive science to study the occurrence and development of poultry diseases, as well as their diagnosis, treatment and prevention; to effectively prevent and treat the herd diseases of poultry and frequently-occurring disease, to ensure the healthy development of animal husbandry;
- (3) veterinary clinical diagnostics: a subject which studies the basic methods and theories of diagnosis and judgment of diseases of livestock and poultry. providing general examination methods, basic principles and necessary theoretical knowledge for diagnosing diseases for other clinical departments.
- (4) veterinary pharmacology: the basic theories of Chinese veterinary medicine and Chinese medicine;
- (5) domestic animal pathology: the metabolic and morphological changes of diseased animals, the elaboration of the cause, occurrence and development of diseases.

- (2) the Key Laboratory of Clinical Diagnosis and Treatment technology for Animal Diseases of Ministry of Education and the Basic Veterinary Laboratory

The participants will communicate online with each other and those professors and experts from Inner Mongolia Agricultural University on the issues concerning basic theories of Chinese veterinary medicine, diagnosis and syndrome differentiation, common Chinese herbs and prescriptions, acupuncture and moxibustion, and prevention and treatment of common diseases and syndromes of domestic animals.

4. Introduction to Key Speakers

The lectures of the Seminar will be delivered by the following professors:

- (1)Hasisurong: doctor, professor, doctoral supervisor; expert of the sixth veterinary drug evaluation, vice president of Camel Branch of China Animal Husbandry Association; research interests: veterinary pharmacokinetics, pharmacology of natural active substances, veterinary clinical pharmacology, and parasitology of ruminant livestock
- (2)Bayinjirigala: doctor, professor, doctoral supervisor; executive director of Chinese Association of Chinese Veterinary Medicine, deputy secretary general of North China Association of Chinese Veterinary Medicine; research interests: traditional Chinese veterinary medicine, focusing on the mechanism of veterinary acupuncture and moxibustion, the extraction, separation and identification of the effective components of Chinese and Mongolian medicine and the pharmacology study of the effective components
- (3)Yang Ying: professor, doctoral supervisor; specialty: clinical veterinary medicine; research interests: Chinese medicine pharmacology and immunology, veterinarian acupuncture; vice president of Veterinary Branch of China Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Medicine Association, vice president of Chinese Veterinary Medicine Research Association in North China
- (4) Wang Jinling: doctor, associate professor, tutor for graduate students; member of Chinese Veterinary Pathologists Society; national professional veterinarian; research interests: zoonotic diseases and immunopathology
