Seminar Content	<p>(1)The Overview of China's National Conditions: This lecture introduces China's national conditions from the political, economic, social and geographical aspects, explains the significance of starting a new era of socialism with Chinese characteristics under the leadership of President Xi Jinping, and helps participants form a more comprehensive understanding of and a bond with China.</p> <p>(2)China's Reform and Opening-up Practices : This section introduces the impact of reform and opening-up policies on China's social development in terms of reform history, reform priorities, regional development, and opening-up to the world.This section focuses on the experience of China's reform and opening up and discusses what can be useful for developing countries.</p> <p>(3)China's Macroeconomic Regulation and Management Practices: This lecture introduces China's practices and shares its experiences in promoting the transformation of macroeconomic regulation and control mechanisms in the process of continuous transformation and development.</p> <p>(4)The Development, Strategies, and Policies of China's Utilization of Foreign Investment: This lecture introduces the historical development, development trends, and policies &amp;</p>	

measures of China's utilization of foreign investment, explains the current new trends and upcoming challenges in China's utilization of foreign investment, and illustrates China's policies and practices in foreign investment management.

(5)The Theory and Practice of World Special Economic Zones: This lecture introduces principles and functions of SEZs in the world, explains the preliminary theoretic preparation in establishing a SEZ, such as its laws, policies, infrastructure, and financing. This lecture will take Tianjin's SEZ (TEDA) as an example to introduce China's experience and lessons from several aspects: the necessity of building an economic park, difficulties in the early stage of an economic park, development model of an economic park's infrastructure, and an economic park's financing.

(6)The Planning System of the Construction of SEZs (Industrial Zones): This lecture will be taken with TEDA being a good example.

(7)SEZ Public Utilities and Municipal Facilities Management: This lecture takes TEDA as a typical case study and explains the subjects responsible for public utilities in economic zones and the contents of public utilities and municipal facilities management.

(8)Special Zones Supervised by the Customs: This lecture introduces the function and classification of this kind of special zones from the dual perspectives of government management and enterprise operation, and focus on aspects such as export processing zones, bonded logistics parks, the foreign trade management in cross-border economic cooperation zones, customs supervision, foreign exchange management, taxation management, and some reform and innovation initiatives.

(9)The Urban Planning, Construction, and Management of TEDA: This lecture demonstrates the entire planning framework of TEDA.

(10)Foreign-Invested Enterprises (FIEs) in China: This lecture introduces the development of FIEs from multiple perspectives: types of foreign investment, the background, development history, relevant laws and regulations, and development characteristics of FIEs. This lecture also explains the approval, guidelines, and procedures of establishing a FIE.

(11)The Financial and Taxation Management System and Policies of Development Zones: This lecture introduces the financial functions, policies, and systems of the government of development zones, and explains the taxation system in China and the preferential taxation policies for foreign enterprises in China.

(12)The Labor Resource Management in Development Zones: This lecture uses TEDA as a case study to explain the labor management regulations of development zones. This lecture also introduces policies concerning human resource, and analyzes the three key elements that promote the development of development zones: labor supply, labor cost, and labor relations.

(13)The Interpretation of the "One-Stop" Management Model of Development Areas and Regulations of Development Areas: This lecture introduces the origin and development of the "One-Stop" management model, explains mechanisms including "acceptance at the same window, approval procedures starting at the same time, time-limit for government work, and transparent information". Participants will also learn the nature, legal effect, and main contents of the Regulations.

(14)Environmental Protection and Green Development of Industrial Parks: This lecture demonstrates the leading ideas and important initiatives in environmental protection in China over the past 40 years since its reform and opening up. The lecture also explains China's institutional system, management system and environmental engineering project construction for environmental protection. In the meanwhile, the framework ideas and progress of China's promotion of circular economy and low-carbon economy will be covered and some classic cases of green development in industrial parks will be shared.

(15)E-Government in Development Zones: Taking TEDA as a typical case, we will introduce the implementation and management of e-government in development zones in terms of policy implementation, "Internet + government services", problems and development trends.

(16)Improve Business Environment and Promote Investment Promotion: This lecture introduces Tianjin Sino-Singapore Eco-city, a successful example of foreign investment promoted by improving business environment, to explain China's efforts in providing optimal business environment, improving competitiveness, offering investment-benefiting services, and propelling the healthy development of economic parks.

(17)Border Trade and Cross-border Economic Cooperation Zone Development: This lecture takes China as an example to explain the border trade policy, discuss the main obstacles faced by the development of border trade and possible ways to solve them; it also compares and

	<p>analyzes the model of cross-border economic cooperation zones at home and abroad than to explore the path of establishing and improving cross-border economic cooperation zones.</p> <p>(18)The Interpretation of the One Belt One Road Initiative: This lecture interprets the Initiative from three aspects, which are putting forward the Initiative, setting objectives for the Initiative, and establishing new systems of economic opening. The idea of bringing people worldwide closer, promoting mutual trust, and enhancing international friendship will be better understood by discussing the policy negotiation, infrastructural connection, free-flowing trade, and capital circulation.</p> <p>(19)Types and Development Characteristics of Industrial Parks in Shenzhen: This lecture explains the development of Shenzhen, a city that developed entirely as a Special Economic Zone.</p> <p>(20)The Development of China's Outward Economy and Its Transformation: This section illustrates the history of China's industrial transformation and upgrading under the background of China's opening-up policy, and the general principles of scaling up the opening for China's economic transformation.</p>
