Briefing of the organizer	<p>Established in 2005, Jiangsu Inspection and Quarantine Institute of Quality (hereinafter referred to as JSIQ) is a public institution affiliated to Nanjing Customs with independent legal personality, and an organizer of the Chinese government's foreign aid training programs.</p> <p>JSIQ is a scientific research institute of quality integrated with quality research, international exchange, comprehensive training and management consultation; it now has seven major departments including the Department of Planning and Development, the Department of Quality Research and Consultation, the Department of International Communication and Cooperation, the Department of Domestic Training, the Department of Macro Quality Management, the Department of Technical Trade Measures, and the Department of Comprehensive Management; It also administers the Certification Consultation Center of CQC and China Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Association Changzhou Branch. There are 40 staff in total.</p> <p>JSIQ has been undertaking the foreign aid training programs of the Chinese government since September 2006. It had undertaken 215 foreign aid training programs successfully as of now. JSIQ has trained more than 6000 officials and technicians from 141 developing countries and international organizations. The subjects of the training programs cover import &amp; export commodity inspection, entry-exit animal and plant quarantine, entry-exit health and quarantine, import-export food safety, origin business of the Customs, trade facilitation of the Customs, standardization, metrology, certification and accreditation, market regulation, intellectual property right, etc. There are 9 working languages: English, French, Russian, Arabic, Spanish, Portuguese, Cambodian, Mongolian and Lao. Thus we have accumulated rich experience in foreign aid training in the field of customs and achieved fruitful results.</p>

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
