About the Organizer	<p>Shanghai Customs College is a normal full-time higher education institution approved by the Ministry of Education and affiliated with the General Administration of Customs, P.R.C. Founded in 1953, the College is currently the only higher education institution offering customs courses and programs in China. In December 2012, it is approved by the State Council Academic Degrees Committee as a trial site for the Program of Personnel Cultivation to Meet Special National Demand - offering master degree program in higher education institutions awarding postgraduate degrees. In serving the customs and the society at large, the College is aimed at cultivating high-caliber customs management personnel and personnel specialized in port logistics and international business in an integrated, applied and foreign-oriented approach, meeting the demand for customs and social-economic development. <p>Seminar Course Content</p>	<p>This 21-day seminar is hosted in Shanghai, China. It includes symposiums, visits & inspections and discussions to introduce the businesses within Chinese customs system in a comprehensive manner. The lecturers of this seminar are invited from Shanghai Customs College, General Administration of Customs and other authoritative agencies and organizations.</p> <p>This seminar will focus on topics such as China's national conditions, general customs system, trade security and facilitation with core curriculum including China's national conditions, Belt & Road Initiative and customs cooperation, classified enterprise management and legal compliance of China customs, non-intrusive inspection equipment - customs intelligent graphic review technology, customs risk management, cross-border e-commerce customs regulation, China e-customs construction as well as special customs surveillance zone management.</p> <p>Participants will be organized to visit the customs operations on sites such as China Customs Intellectual Property Protection Center, intelligent graphic review site, National Marine Cargo Risk Prevention & Control Center, Customs Inspection & Quarantine Joint Command Center and Laboratory and NUCTH production base (non-intrusive inspection equipment manufacturer). Cultural experience events include watching performance at Shanghai Circus World, Shanghai Yu Garden, traditional shadow boxing, martial art museum, Shanghai Natural History Museum and Shanghai A.P. Plaza. In addition, participants will also be invited to experience the local manners and practices in Qingdao of Shandong Province and Changzhou of Jiangsu Province.</p> <p>Discussions will be hosted between officials from developing countries and China customs experts on such topics as the functions, developments and challenges of the customs and connectivity - exchange and sharing of customs data.
