1. Medical doctor or degree/diploma holder in related medical professions e.g paramedics, nurses
2. Working in the hospital's emergency department or pre-hospital care services
3. Preferably able to initiate changes to their local or regional systems
4. Basic knowledge on local disaster management system
5. Fit and healthy

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

- Applications should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available through <https://mtcp.kln.gov.my> application forms can also be obtained from the nearest Malaysian Embassy / High Commission in MTCP recipient countries. Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the following documents:
 - Copy of Passport (all colored pages including blank pages, front & back cover)
 - 2 copies Passport sized photo (3.5cm x 5cm) (White background)
 - 6 months passport validity
 - Medical Report (with clinics' official seal)
 - Participants should be medically fit to travel and complete the training course
- **All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission of Malaysia.**
- **Successful candidates will be duly notified with Official Invitation one (1) month before the commencement of the course date by the National Authority via email.**
- **Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.**

COURSE FEES, ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

Participants will receive support from the Governments of Malaysia including:

- All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.
- Participants will be accommodated at a hotel / hostel within the vicinity of the training institute. Participants are strictly not allowed to bring any family members during the course.
- Participants will be provided with daily allowance.
- Meals will be provided throughout the duration of the course.

VISA AND VACCINATION

All participants **must** enter Malaysia with Visa With Reference (VWR). Participants for the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from the National Authority. Participant are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission. Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving in Malaysia. Participants from countries listed in <https://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country/> are required to take mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccination certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

AIR FARES

A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants.



ABOUT MTCP

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasises the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. As of 31st December 2023, 37,815 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

The National Authority Chemical Weapons Convention (NACWC) of Malaysia is instrumental in ensuring compliance with the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC), the sole international treaty to comprehensively ban an entire category of weapons of mass destruction. Malaysia ratified the convention on 20 May 2000, entrusting the NACWC with leading non-proliferation efforts. Collaborating closely with relevant government bodies and international partners, the NACWC ensures adherence to treaty obligations and fosters capacity building in areas such as assistance and protection against chemical weapons, reinforcing Malaysia's commitment to CWC implementation and global security.
