COURSE FEES, ACCOMODATION & MEAL

Accomodation: All applicants will be housed in hostels, with one room allotted to each. Participants are strictly not allowed to bring any family members during the course.

Daily Allowance: Participants will be provided with daily allowance.

Meals: Meals will be provided throughout the duration of the course.

Airfares: A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants.

Course Fees: All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.

Dress Code: Participants are required to dress in uniform, formal or office attire throughout the class sessions as well as during official visits to Government Ministries/Agencies.

All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission of Malaysia.

Successful candidates will be duly notified by AMSAS one (1) month before the commencement of the course.

Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.

VISA AND VACCINATION

All participants must enter Malaysia with Visa With Reference (VWR). Participants for the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from AMSAS. Participant are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission. Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving in Malaysia. Participants from countries listed in

services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country/ are required to take a mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccination certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasises the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. As of 31st December 2023, 37,815 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

AMSAS was established to carry out the agency's functions in line with the provisions of the law as stated in Part III Section 6 (1) (g) of the Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA) Act 2004 (Act 633) which is establishing and managing maritime institutions for the training of MMEA Officers. Formerly known as PPL APMM, AMSAS has been training MMEA staff since April 2005, in a residential building block for trainees temporarily loaned by the Royal Malaysian Navy (RLDM), Lumut. On 24 July 2007, the training institute moved to Bandar Indera Mahkota, Kuantan.

AMSAS was then finally shifted from a temporary building in Bandar Indera Mahkota, Kuantan to a well-equipped training centre in Sungai Ular, Gebeng, Pahang on 1 August 2011. The newly built institution is able to accommodate and train more officers due to its strategic location. On 2 March 2013, AMSAS was inaugurated by His Majesty Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah of Pahang. AMSAS is capable of training basic courses for new MMEA staff, as well as accommodating advanced courses including maritime training in the region.
