## **Singapore Cooperation Programme**

Singapore has provided technical assistance to other developing countries since the 1960s. As a country whose only resource is its people, Singapore believes that human resource development is vital for economic and social progress. Singapore itself has benefited from training provided by other countries and international organisations.

In 1992, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) was established to bring together under one framework the various technical assistance programmes offered by Singapore. Through the SCP, the range and number of training programmes were increased to share Singapore's development experience with other developing countries.

To date, over 132,000 officials from more than 180 countries and territories have participated in our courses and study visits. The SCP is managed by the Technical Cooperation Directorate of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore.

## **Civil Service College**

Civil Service College (CSC) is the central learning institution for the Singapore Public Service. It plays a pivotal role in nurturing and developing people for a first-class Public Service. As a Statutory Board under the Prime Minister's Office, we endeavour to be the heart of learning excellence and development for the Singapore Public Service.

# **Course Objectives**

Climate change is a complex global challenge that needs collective action. Climate Finance, a subset of Green Finance, plays an important role in supporting the world's transition towards a low-carbon future. It refers to financial resources and initiatives that seeks to support mitigation and adaption measures to tackle the challenges of climate change.

As part of Singapore's efforts to do our part to build a sustainable future, the Singapore Green Plan 2030 was launched and the Singapore Government has taken active steps to drive long-term effective climate action, involving multiple stakeholders from financial institutions to non-financial partners.

The programme aims to discuss the financing mechanisms available to support climate change projects, as well as to share Singapore's active measures to build a climate resilient future.

# **Synopsis**

Topics to be covered include:

- Understanding Climate Finance;
- Opportunities and Potential for Green Financing and Green Investment;
- Improving on Sustainability-Related Financial Reporting;
- Building a Green & Sustainable Future in the case of Singapore's Green Plan 2030; and
- Singapore's Move Towards a Low Carbon Future: Green Growth Opportunities.

# Methodology

This course will be delivered for up to <u>30</u> participants.

This virtual training programme will comprise a mix of synchronous and asynchronous learning components. The synchronous components will conducted live over the Zoom Platform, and include a series of interactive and thematic sharing sessions, dialogues and facilitated discussions and reflections. Participants will also have adequate opportunity to share their experiences, learning points and challenges during the programme. Asynchronous components will comprise a mix of articles, videos and other e-learning materials to complement the various synchronous sessions.

# Regulations

Participants are required to comply with the following:

- Strictly observe course schedules and not miss training sessions, and;
- Carry out instructions and abide by conditions as may be stipulated by the nominating Authority or Government and the Government of Singapore and its appointed trainer, with respect to the course.

### Duration

The course will be held over 5 days from 17 to 21 January 2022. Four hours of 'Live' synchronous sessions will be conducted each day on the Zoom platform from 1330 to 1730 hours (Singapore time; UTC/GMT+08:00 hours).

Actual timings of the synchronous e-learning sessions will be confirmed closer to the course dates, and more details on the programme schedule will be provided to successful applicants prior to the start of course.

## **Application Information**

Applicants should be:

- Mid- to senior-level government officials who are involved in policymaking related to (i) climate change, (ii) green finance projects and related fields:
- Able to attend all the live synchronous sessions.
  They will require an internet-enabled device with Zoom installed, webcam, microphone and audio:
- Nominated by their respective Governments;
- Proficient in written and spoken English; and
- In good health.
