Singapore Cooperation Programme

Singapore has provided technical assistance to other developing countries since the 1960s. As a country whose only resource is its people, Singapore believes that human resource development is vital for economic and social progress. Singapore itself has benefited from training provided by other countries and international organisations.

In 1992, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) was established to bring together under one framework the various technical assistance programmes offered by Singapore. Through the SCP, the range and number of training programmes were increased to share Singapore's development experience with other developing countries.

To date, over 132,000 officials from more than 170 countries and territories have participated in our courses and study visits. The SCP is managed by the Technical Cooperation Directorate of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore.

Colombo Plan Staff College

The Colombo Plan Staff College for Technician Education (CPSC) is an autonomous specialised agency of the Colombo Plan. It was established on December 5, 1973 at the 23rd Consultative Committee Meeting of the Colombo Plan held in Wellington, New Zealand to assist the member countries of the Colombo Plan in developing and enhancing the quality of technical and vocational education and training (TVET) systems through planning and implementation of demand-driven training programs; research and development; information dissemination and consultancv activities in Asia and the Pacific region. It became operational in 1974 with the Republic of Singapore serving as the first host Government. In 1987, CPSC moved to Manila, Philippines upon the invitation of the Philippine Government.



Course Objectives

At the end of the program, the participants will be able to:

- Understand the concept and principles of Green TVET and green skills development
- Apply the five pillars strategy of greening TVET
- Develop action plan for the implementation of five pillars strategy of greening TVET.

Synopsis

Topics to be covered include:

- Five Pillars Strategies of greening TVET
- Integration of green skills in curricula.
- International practices and innovative initiatives in greening TVET
- Practices of greening TVET in the context of Singapore
- Policy intervention to greening TVET

Methodology

This course will be delivered for up to <u>40 participants</u> through *synchronous e-Learning* ('live' e-learning sessions). There will be Q&A sessions and facilitated group discussions during the 'live' sessions.

Regulations

Participants are required to comply with the following:

- Strictly observe course schedules and not miss training sessions, and;
- Carry out instructions and abide by conditions as may be stipulated by the nominating Authority or Government, the Government of Singapore and the training partner (Colombo Plan Staff College), with respect to the course.

Duration

The course will be held over 5 days from <u>14 to 18</u> <u>December 2020</u>.

The '*Live*' *e-learning sessions* will be conducted from 1300 to 1600 (Singapore time; UTC+08:00 hours) each day.

Applicants should be:

- Managers, principals, instructional designers and mid- to senior-level TVET trainers from government institutions;
- Able to attend **all** the synchronous e-learning sessions. They will require an internet-enabled device with Zoom installed, and an internetenabled device with functioning webcam, microphone and audio;
- Nominated by their respective Governments;
- Proficient in written and spoken English; and
- In good health.

Terms of Award

The course is sponsored by the Government of Singapore and the Colombo Plan Staff College, under the Singapore-Colombo Plan Staff College Joint Training Programme.

Selection of candidates will be based on merit.
